## **1. The Topic**

The GARNET Network of Excellence aims at creating a European research area on governance, regulation and the relationship between multilateralism and regionalism.

The PhD Winter School is closely connected to the GARNET JERP 5.3.1 “Global Environmental Governance. The organisers and core teaching staff of the PhD Winter School are involved in this JERP”, which aims at analysing the actual state of environmental governance and the theoretical design of co-operative policies in this field.

The PhD Winter School intends to:

- introduce concepts and problems in global environmental governance and outline special conflict fields,
- discuss risk perception and approaches to risk assessment as well as responsibility and precaution in multi-level policy fields,
- analyse ideological and spatial cross-cutting aspects, such as gender and public opinion on the environment

The teaching methods will vary between presentations, talks, working group sessions, excursions and gender awareness exercises and aim at:

- sensitising for different policy fields of environmental governance through problem-orientated treatment of information,
- reflecting on socio-ecologic approaches for analysis and evaluation of environmental policies,
- comprehending proactive strategies of environmental governance strategies.
